

AIDS Healthcare Foundation is Announcing Request for Proposals

Beginning August 2009, AHF will launch its first effort to support local organizations providing HIV Testing and prevention services in Los Angeles County. A total of \$500,000 will be granted with an average award amount of \$50,000. The request for proposals will happen in two phases.

Phase 1: Invitations to apply will be mailed to those organizations that are current partners with the AIDS Healthcare Foundation's Domestic Testing Initiative. The total amount available for these awards is \$300,000. An estimated 4 – 6 agencies will be funded with an average award amount of \$50,000.

Phase 2: The request for proposals will be extended to all community based organizations in Los Angeles County with a history and/or interest of providing HIV prevention services. The total amount available for these awards is 200,000. An estimated 3 – 5 agencies will be funded with an average award amount of \$50,000.

ELIGIBILITY REQUIREMENTS:

- Agency must provide services in Los Angeles County
- Organizations that have 501(c) (3) status

GUIDELINES:

The proposed program **must address the Foundation's national goals** and demonstrate the ability to offer HIV testing and prevention services in the LA County. Priority will be given to those organizations that have a history of serving populations at risk for HIV and/or those organizations that have a strong commitment to sexual health promotion.

Each applicant must complete the cover sheet, proposal narrative and program budget.

The proposal narrative should be double spaced, have 1” margins and use a 12 point font.

Make sure to include the supporting documents listed on the coversheet and checklist. These applications must be received by 5:00 p.m. on July 10, 2009.

Proposal
Funding cycle August 2009 – July 31, 2010

Proposed Program Narrative (maximum, 16 double spaced pages)

This section should include:

- Agency's mission and history
- Evidence or data to support the need for the program
- Program design
- Target population
- Activities
- Measurable objectives and outcomes
- Organizational capacity
- Collaborations needed to fulfill the proposed program
- Possible obstacles in implementing the proposed program (ex. training needs, resources, funding, etc.)
- Evaluation and/or tracking lessons learned

Budget

Line-item budget request (1 -2 pages)

Time period for budget August 2009 – July 31, 2009

Show all expenses and resources required

Budget justification (2-4 pages)

Please include narrative descriptions to support the items included in the line-item budget
